4h. Accompaniment

Programs are responsible for ensuring that an individual (service member or staff member), for whom the results of the statewide and FBI criminal registry checks are initiated and pending completion, is not permitted to have access to vulnerable populations (children age 17 and younger, persons age 60 and older, or individuals with disabilities) without being accompanied by either an authorized program representative who has previously been cleared for such access; a family member or legal guardian of the individual; or an individual authorized by the nature of his/her profession to have recurring access to the vulnerable individuals, such as an education or medical professional. Accompanied means that the member must be in the direct line of site of the person supervising them. Accompaniment may cease when both the FBI and state checks have cleared. Please keep in mind that instate and state of residence at time of application checks are required. Each instance of accompaniment must be documented, including the date, time, location, and name of person who provided accompaniment on the member timesheet in OnCorps. Regardless of supervision, programs shall ensure that no member or employee serve hours prior to completion of the National Sex Offender Public Website (NSOPR), and initiation of the FBI and state checks.
