

Nevada Volunteers recognizes that understanding the various streams of National Service can be challenging. This chart will help you answer questions to determine if National Service may be a fit for your organization.

Nevada Volunteers is proud to serve as the Governor's Commission on Service, one of 53 state service commissions. Nevada Volunteers works to empower citizens to meet the needs of Nevada through service and volunteerism.

State Commissions were designed to be in every state and build the <u>national service public and</u> <u>private partnership</u> as a 1:1 match between states and the federal government. In Nevada the commission federal funds are matched with state, private and in-kind sources.

Nevada Volunteers develops a State Service Plan which is adopted by the Governor. The State Service Plans serves as a blueprint for maximizing civic engagement, volunteerism and service in Nevada to meet Nevada's unmet needs. Nevada Volunteers serves as the convening organization for all "streams of national service" in Nevada.
