Opportunity Awaits You

The federal Corporation for National and Community Service, the umbrella organization for AmeriCorps, is committed to making national service opportunities accessible and attractive to Americans of all backgrounds. Nevada Volunteers, which coordinates AmeriCorps programs in Nevada, aims to find ways for people with disabilities to share in the spirit of service.

Consider AmeriCorps

AmeriCorps members serve either full or part-time and receive a modest living allowance, student loan forbearance, and health care and child care coverage for those who qualify.

After you complete your term of service, you will also receive a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award, which you can use to help pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to repay student loans.

Your Income Stays Safe

Under the Heroes Earnings Assistance and Relief Tax Act of 2008 (HEART Act), recipients of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) who enroll in AmeriCorps will not lose SSI benefits or eligibility. Your AmeriCorps allowance will not be used to calculate your financial eligibility for any future SSI benefits after your AmeriCorps term of service is complete. While the law does not extend to Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), it removes a significant barrier to participation for SSI recipients.

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, everyone has the right to request reasonable accommodation for disabilities involving visual, hearing, learning, mobility, and mental health.



AmeriCorps welcomes members of all abilities and backgrounds. You must be at least 17 and a legal resident of the United States.
